Meal Charges for the Elementary:

Breakfast - \$1.70

Lunch – \$2.80

Milk - .50 cents

If you get just a milk, it is 50 cents. Milk is included in the meal however; by itself, there is a charge that is not covered by the free and reduced lunch program.

For visiting parents an adult meal can be ordered at the price of \$4 for lunch and \$3.20 for breakfast but must be ordered either the day before or early the same morning. Call the office.

- * Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of the 3rd grade.
- * By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of High School.
- * Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school, or about 15 days in our school, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That is just two days a month and is known as chronic absence.
- * When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating!
