CL Distance Learning/Homeschool Partnership Option

Homeschool Option

Overview: Students and families in this option will have direct instruction from a licensed teacher. Assignments, assessments, texts, and needed materials will be provided by the school. The parent does not need to provide these.

Point Person : Licensed elementary and Jr/Sr high staff will coordinate student coursework and services.

Curriculum:

- Regular Teacher-Designed In-Person Class curriculum aligned to state standards (ES and HS)
- Journeys/ECRI/Title I (ES)
- Engage NY Math/CPM (ES) Math Space (HS)
- Supplemental Imagine Learning
- Dual Credit courses for high school and college credit at no charge to families (HS)
- Band, Choir, and Agriculture elective classes available to students

Additional Resources:

- Chromebook & touch tablets with Tech Support to each student provided by District
- Grab and go or delivered lunches
- Full IEP, Mental Health, and Academic Support Services
- Daily virtual interaction with Teachers & Peers Participation in school sports covered by the district and no cost to families

In Case of Mandated School Closure:

- No change

Budget Resources: Keeps local property taxes local and each enrolled student also receives a state subsidy approximately equal to local property taxes.

Simplified School Formula: 600 students x \$10,000 per student = \$6,000,000 - less local property tax is \$3,000,000 = State subsidy to CL \$3,000,000. Amount received from state per enrolled student is \$5,000. 500 students x \$10,000 per student = \$5,000,000 - less local property tax is \$3,000,000 = State subsidy to CL \$2,000,000. Amount received from state per enrolled student is \$4,000. Each homeschooled student reduces District funding by approximately \$10,000. Overview: Students and families in this option will work completely from home and must be registered as a homeschool student through the local ESD. The parent is responsible for purchasing and implementing all academic lessons and materials. These costs are incurred by the families. State testing required through LBL/ESD.

Point Person: The parent is responsible for all areas of the homeschool student's academics.

Curriculum:

- Parent determined.
- Child must be tested at grades 3, 5, 8, and 10. This test is at the expense of the parent.
- Jr/Sr High on-campus electives (Band, Choir, and Agriculture) will not be available to homeschool students for the 20-21 school year.

Additional Resources:

- Local homeschool cohort groups
- Facebook homeschool groups, as available
- Special education services will not be provided by the school district. Needs must be met by the parent at the expense of the parent.
- Participation in school sports cost \$100 per sport per individual, no scholarships

Transportation Option:

Budget Resources: The District, nor the parent receive any state subsidy and local property taxes flow to the state through the state school formula.
