On January 23rd, the CL School Board met for a work session around the topic of facilities. The focus of this meeting was to summarize the history of why the board decided to go for a K-12 school bond last May, hear a presentation on the benefits of a K12 campus, compare the costs of a new K12 campus vs. the cost of just a new secondary campus utilizing a monolithic dome design to bring down construction costs, since bringing down the cost of the last bond was a clear message received by the board from the public in the survey that was sent to those who voted in the last election.

The board concluded that no decision could be made towards supporting a K12 campus, until the cost of repairing the existing grade school was researched and presented. The board prioritized a list of what repairs they would want to see completed at the grade school. These repairs and their associated costs will be presented at the next work session which is scheduled for February 8th at 6:30 at the high school cafeteria. The board appreciated hearing from the public who attended our last session. After the meeting was adjourned the board members stayed and listened and discussed with those present their thoughts and ideas. Thank you for your involvement.
